

## Q1: Jews in Israel are a different nation from the Jews abroad (%, by year)









## Q2: Jews in Israel and in the Diaspora share a common fate (%, by year)





There is no systematic correlation between answers to Q1 and Q2.


Counter-intuitively the sense of a shared fate does not necessarily correspond with a sense of shared identity.








### Q3: Primary connection between Israeli & Diaspora Jewry (%)

#### Q4 & Q5

Q4: A majority (71%) believe that Israel's government should take into account the impact of its decisions on Diaspora Jewry.

Q5: Split opinion (51% for, 47% against) on whether to take into account (or not) the views of Jews in the Diaspora

Israelis are careful not to jeopardize the relationship with Diaspora but do not see Jews there as part of the "we" circle (corresponds with Q1).







## Q7: Equal status for non Orthodox (Reform & Conservative) movements in Israel (%)










